Memorandum of Understanding

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING made this **1stDay of February 2022**,

Between:

Don Bosco Institute of Technology, Kurla, Mumbai hereinafter called DBIT-Don Bosco, as one part of the MOU

AND

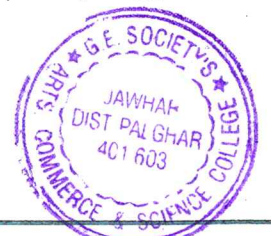
Gokhale Education Society's- Arts, Commerce and Science College, Jawhar hereinafter called GES Jawhar College as another part of the MOU.

Whereas, Gokhale Education Society's Arts & Commerce College Jawhar was established in June 1983 and is affiliated to University of Mumbai. It is also an ISO 9001:2005 certified institute. Jawhar College is re-accredited by NAAC with B++ grade. Presently, around 1200 students are enrolled every year in the college and almost 1500 students admitted under YCMOU centre of college. More than 90% students belong to the Tribal and backward categories.

It is now agreed between DBIT and GES Jawhar College as below:

Responsibility of DBIT

- 1) DBIT will provide certification courses to the students of Jawhar College to enable them to seek employability. The courses will include but are not limited to web designing, mobile app designing, GIS mapping, 3D printing of Warli art. The curriculum for the courses will be designed by DBIT in consultation with industry experts
- 2) The students of Jawhar college will be taught special topics in Maths, Physics and Chemistry by the faculty of DBIT to improve their subject understanding and prepare them for university exams
- 3) DBIT faculty will conduct sessions on English communication, oral and written, and personality development for the students.



- 4) DBIT staff and students will design a web portal through which Jawhar college students can access employment opportunities in nearby industrial areas.
- 5) DBIT will conduct regular assessment of the students
- 4) All courses will be conducted in the premises of Jawhar College.
- 5) All training will be conducted during the college hours or on vacation.
- 6) Skill training and teaching program will be conducted by DBIT at NO COST.
- 7) Certification to the student after completion of the course. Certificate must have the logo of the DBIT and Jawhar College.
- 8) DBIT will provide training only for the students of GES Jawhar College.
- 9) After completion of each course, a written & practical exam will be conducted by DBIT

Responsibility of GES Jawhar College.

1. Make available classroom/computer lab for the skill training courses.
2. Appoint faculty co-ordinators for each programme and an SPC for the collective endeavours under the MoU
2. Make arrangements for lodging and boarding (if required) for the teachers and trainers
3. Maintain all the reports/attendance of the participants as per the format provided by DBIT.
4. Publicise the courses and enrol the aspirants for the course/training/program.
5. Publicise the outcomes of the MoU in various forum
6. Appoint a senior faculty as the SPO (Single point of contact) to communicate and coordinate the activities of the MoU

Other Terms and Conditions:


- 1) All courses will be conducted in Jawhar college premises during college working hours
- 2) DBIT will not expect any monetary compensation from the college or the students for the training and lecture sessions
- 3) Certificates awarded to the students will feature logos of both institutes and will have signatories from both institutes.
- 4) DBIT will share the outcome of the training with Jawhar college
- 5) Both institutes will conduct a quarterly review of the progress of the MoU and submit reports after completion of each activity

Project Justification- Problems/Situation of Tribal's in Jawhar

Jawharis classified as 'Scheduled Areas'. This means that they are recognized as predominantly tribal areas in which indigenous people have certain special rights under their local self-governance institutions. For instance, the assembly of villagers (Gram Sabha) has the right to determine who the beneficiaries of government schemes will be, it has the right to prevent land alienation and restore land to the tribal population, etc.

The Tribals have no option but to move away from their traditional non-monetary economic system into the modern money economy. However, most of them have not been able to make the mental shift that this transition demands. In their barter system, they used to consume or use the goods they acquired almost immediately. This practice continues even in their present dealings with money—they tend to spend their wages immediately and saving is an alien concept to many of them. This in turn creates a negative image; the perception in larger society is that Tribals are wasteful and are not credit worthy.

The livelihood options that they have leave them with little chance to save, even if they want to. Since their agriculture is for mere subsistence and not for sale of the yield, they can earn money only by selling forest produce or by working as wage labourers. This shortage of ready cash means that they cannot cope with emergencies such as illness, crop failure, etc. Hence, the working of the economic system ensures that they remain trapped in their present situation.

Literacy level is not very positive in Jawhar block. In Jawhar only 54% of the people are literate. Women literacy level is low compared to male. In Jawhar only 42% of the women are literate.
